(Wilmington, Del.) February 13, 2017 – The <u>University of Delaware</u> presents <u>Serafin String Quartet</u> with pianist, Julie Nishimura on March 7, 2017 at 8:00 p.m. The concert program features Beethoven String Quartet in C Major, Op. 59#3, the "third Razumovsky" quartet was one of three written for the Russian count and is famed for its virtuoso last movement - a large scale fugue that opens with the Viola stating the lively theme, and Brahms Piano Quintet, described as the pinnacle work for the string quartet and piano ensemble configuration - a masterful monument that is both profound and sublime.

Serafin String Quartet serves as the University of Delaware's *Quartet in Residence*, where they perform concerts, present master classes, coach student chamber groups, and, most recently, host string events/ workshops. UD's Department of Music is dedicated to the musical growth of its students and the cultural enrichment of the community, offering a range of music majors and minors and presenting a variety of public performances.

Hailed for "silken finesse and gritty vibrancy" by *Gramophone Magazine* and for "playing with style and sophistication" by *The Strad Magazine*, Serafin String Quartet debuted at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall in 2004 and has consistently received superlatives in the press and ovations by audiences around the nation. The Quartet's highly acclaimed Naxos (2013) release featuring world premiere recordings of early chamber works by Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Jennifer Higdon was listed as "Top 10 Classical Albums in 2013" by Philadelphia's City Paper. The Quartet's debut recording on Centaur (2010) is an "American Tapestry" of works by American composers and composers influenced by American sounds, including Barber, Dvorák, Gershwin and William Grant Still. The Quartet is nester violin maker, Sanctus Serafin, who in 1728 crafted the violin currently played by SSQ violinist Kate Ransom.
