Serafin Summer Music Festival Brings Exceptional Chamber Artists to Delaware June 20-30 New festival features eight scintillating performances by eighteen accomplished artists

(Wilmington, Del.) May 10, 2019 - <u>Serafin Ensemble</u>, in partnership with the <u>University of Delaware</u> <u>Department of Music</u> and <u>The Music School of Delaware</u>, present <u>Serafin Summer Music</u> from June 20-30, 2019. For Delaware chamber music lovers, the new festival fills a void left by the Delaware Chamber Music Festival which discontinued after their June 2017 concerts.

The eighteen artists of the festival include accomplished artists from around the United States, including Oklahoma, Ohio, Kentucky, Atlanta, Florida and New York, along with performers from the University of Delaware and The Music School of Delaware.

"Bringing superb artists together to prepare and share marvelous masterworks with a community of eager listeners is a thrilling creative enterprise in every respect," comments <u>Kate Ransom</u>, Artistic Director. "Planning the programming is, in itself, a wonderful undertaking."

Kate Ransom's role as Serafin violinist, along with her affiliation as President of The Music School of Delaware, and with the University of Delaware, offered special synergy to make the new festival possible. Leaders of each organization have supported the collaborative effort to start Serafin Summer Music, with sponsorship support from Dr. William Stegeman, Ph.D., <u>Jacobs Music Company</u>, <u>Harry's Savoy Grill</u>, <u>Tonic Bar and Grille</u>, <u>Delaware Today</u>, <u>WDEL</u> and <u>GateHouse Media Delaware</u>.

Each concert will have a unique theme and ensemble configuration of up to six string, wind, piano and vocal performers devoted to collaborative chamber music performances. The repertoire includes works by the great classical composers, including Beethoven, Schumann and Brahms, as well as works by lesser-known composers, such as Smetana, Khachaturian and Faure.

"I look forward to an exceptional festival where we will showcase a sampling of the incredible musical talent in Delaware while introducing our audiences to amazing guest artists from around the nation," says <u>Augustine Mercante</u>, Festival Manager.

All performances will be held at The Music School of Delaware, Wilmington Branch, 4101 N. Washington Street, Wilmington, DE.
