Serafin String Quartet Returns to Milton Theatre on September 22

(Wilmington, Del.) August 23, 2017 - The critically acclaimed <u>Serafin String Quartet</u> returns to the Milton Theatre on **Friday, September 22 at 8:00 p.m.** The Quartet will perform **Haydn String Quartet in G Minor, Op. 74, No. 3** "**Horseman,**" the most famous among Haydn's six quartets of 1793, whose 'galloping' finale theme has given rise to its nickname; and **Mendelssohn String Quartet in E Minor, Op. 44, No. 2**, a work filled with infectious energy and elegant lyricism.

Hailed for "silken finesse and gritty vibrancy" by *Gramophone Magazine* and for "playing with style and sophistication" by *The Strad Magazine*, Serafin String Quartet debuted at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall in 2004 and has consistently received ovations from audiences around the nation. The Quartet returned to Weill Recital Hall in March 2016 to perform the New York premieres of works by composer Julia Adolphe. The Serafin's 2017-18 season includes performances in NY, PA, FL, OK, and DE.

The Quartet's highly acclaimed Naxos (2013) release featuring world premiere recordings of early chamber works by Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Jennifer Higdon was listed as "Top 10 Classical Albums in 2013" by Philadelphia's City Paper. The Quartet's debut recording on Centaur (2010) is an "American Tapestry" of works by American composers and composers influenced by American sounds, including Barber, Dvorák, Gershwin and William Grant Still. The Quartet serves as Quartet in Residence at the University of Delaware and takes its name from master violin maker, Sanctus Serafin, who in 1728 crafted the violin currently played by SSQ violinist Kate Ransom.
